Opportunities Abound for East Idaho Students through The Idaho Community Foundation's Scholarship Programs

Supporting the educational dreams of students in the East region of Idaho

IDAHO - The Idaho Community Foundation is proud to announce that students in the East region of Idaho can apply for more than 15 unique scholarship opportunities this year. Thanks to the generosity of charitable Idahoans, these funds aim to provide financial support to students pursuing higher education, helping them fulfill their academic goals and career aspirations.

Scholarships available for students in the East region include:

- **Diamond W. Scholarship Fund** For graduating seniors at Snake River High School planning to attend any college or university, with preference given to those studying in Idaho.
- J. Carl Mattson Scholarship Fund Open to students from Firth High School who have completed six trimesters of Vocational Agriculture and have been active in FFA.
- Preston and Franklin County High School Alumni Scholarship Fund Designed to support graduates of Preston High School or Franklin County High School who plan to attend an accredited college, university, or vocational school.

• W.L. Shattuck Scholarship Fund – For students aged 16-26 with financial need who have graduated from Idaho Falls School District 91 or 93.

Additionally, several statewide scholarships are available, including:

- Alois and Marie Goldmann Memorial Scholarship Fund This scholarship program is open to graduating seniors from any Idaho high school attending a higher education institution in Idaho.
- **Yvonne and Dick Lierz Scholarship Fund** Eligible applicants must be first- or second-year undergraduate students enrolled at any public institution of higher education in Idaho or Nevada and must show participation in at least one community-benefiting volunteer activity.

Scholarship eligibility criteria vary by region, county, and area of study. Through these scholarships, The Idaho Community Foundation seeks to honor the vision of Idaho donors who believe in the transformative power of education and are committed to nurturing future generations of leaders.
