The Idaho Community Foundation Awards Over \$1.1 Million in Forever Idaho Grants Across the State

Boise, Idaho – The Idaho Community Foundation (ICF) is proud to announce that more than \$1.1 million has been awarded through its 2024 Forever Idaho grant program, benefiting 210 nonprofit and educational organizations across Idaho. These funds address critical needs in health and wellness, housing stability, arts and culture, education, and community development.

The Forever Idaho program is unique in its ability to provide unrestricted funding, allowing nonprofits the flexibility to address their communities' most urgent and evolving challenges. These grants are made possible through the collective generosity of Idaho donors who believe in strengthening local communities.

Empowering Idaho Communities

Each region in Idaho benefits from the Forever Idaho grants.

- **Eastern Idaho:** The East Region, including Bannock, Bear Lake, Bingham, Bonneville, Butte, Caribou, Clark, Custer, Fremont, Jefferson, Lemhi, Madison, Oneida, Power, and Teton counties, awarded nearly \$250,000 supporting 50 organizations including The Community Food Basket in Idaho Falls who received \$12,000 to support health and wellness initiatives.
- North Idaho: The North Region, including Benewah, Bonner, Boundary, Clearwater, Idaho, Kootenai, Latah, Lewis, and Nez Perce counties, received more than \$275,000 for 40 organizations including Kaniksu Land Trust who received \$12,500 to support community benefit programs in Bonner County.
- **South Central Idaho:** The South Central Region, including Blaine, Camas, Cassia, Gooding, Jerome, Lincoln, Minidoka, and Twin Falls counties, received nearly \$214,000 for 34 organizations including \$20,000 to Valley House Homeless Shelter to address housing stability in Twin Falls County.

• **Southwest Idaho:** The Southwest Region, including Ada, Adams, Boise, Canyon, Gem, Owyhee, Payette, Valley, and Washington, received over \$385,000 to support 86 organizations including \$12,000 to support The Jesse Tree of Idaho and their efforts to provide housing assistance in Ada County.

Forever Idaho funds are generated annually through the contributions of Idaho residents and businesses who elect to support their regional grant cycle.

"Our Forever Idaho grants reflect the power of collective giving," said Steve Burns, President & CEO of The Idaho Community Foundation. "These funds empower nonprofits to respond to the unique and dynamic needs of their communities, whether that's housing stability, educational opportunities, or community enrichment. It's inspiring to see Idahoans come together to strengthen the places we call home."
